A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. HOLY BAPTISM

God's Call

Dear friends in Christ, God is love, God gives us life. We love because God first loves us. In baptism God declares that love; in Christ God calls us to respond.

The Presentation for Baptism

The candidate for baptism is presented by parents and godparents:

I present *N*______ to be baptized and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

The presider addresses the congregation

From the beginning the Church has received believers by baptism. Believers' children have also been baptized so that with help and encouragement they should grow up in Christ and by the grace of God serve Christ all the days of their life.

On the day when the apostles first preached the Gospel of Christ's resurrection, Peter urged his hearers: "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus the Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God may call."

The presider directs these questions to the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of infants and younger children.

Question How do you respond to this promise?

Answer We hear God's call and ask for baptism.

Question Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is

brought up in the Christian faith and life.

Answer I will, with God's help.

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness

that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and

destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of

God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Question Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do.

The presider addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to Question

support these persons in their life in Christ?

Baptism and Chrismation

The candidate is presented by name to the presider, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying

N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

Then the presider places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using chrism and saying to each one

N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen*.

When this action has been completed for all the candidates, the presider prays over them, saying

Let us pray. Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen*.

The presider then says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

Asperges

The presider blesses the people with Holy Water as a sign of our renewed baptismal vows.



Gift Card Phishing Scams Both email and text phishing scams rely on impersonation tactics to engage with victims to ask them to purchase gift cards. The attackers leverage authority and urgency in their requests and will frequently impersonate employees of St. John's as part of the scam. After a few exchanges the person asks you to purchase gift cards and send them the activation codes. These attacks work because they are a simple, quick way to get money, especially when the email or text are impersonating someone at the church. If you get any kind of email or text from someone at St. John's asking if you "are available?" or asking for you to only "text them", before responding, reach out to the sender in a separate message or call them to check if they actually sent the request. Don't reply to the email or text or use any contact information provided in the reply - attackers often provide fake numbers or email addresses that they control. St. John's clergy or staff will NEVER ask you to purchase gift cards for them.

Music Notes Pentecost is often thought of as a Christian holiday, but the name "Pentecost" (which is Greek for "fiftieth," as in "the fiftieth day") originally applied to the "Feast of Weeks," an important feast day in ancient Israel celebrating God's giving of the *Torah* to Moses on Mount Sinai. The feast is known today as *Shavuot* and occurs fifty days after Passover. According to Christian tradition, it was on the day of Pentecost that God gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to the followers of Jesus, hence the birth of a new movement known as Christianity. Pentecost is sometimes described by Christians today as the "Birthday of the Church."

"Draw us in the Spirit's tether" was a hymn tune written in 1945 by Harold Friedell, who was the influential music director at Calvary Church and then St. Bartholomew's Church in New York City. Using a text written by Percy Dearmer in 1931, Friedell composed it as a communion hymn specifically for Pentecost Sunday 1945. Taking his previously composed hymn tune, Friedell created the SATB anthem arrangement the choir is singing this morning. The hymn text begins in the upper room with the disciples and comes full circle as we join them around the table and are nourished to serve others in the world. Dearmer distinguished himself in the field of hymnology as the co- editor, with composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, of *The English Hymnal* (1906). He also co-edited *The Oxford Book of Carols* (1928) and other major collections.

Hymnes and Songes of the Church, published in 1623 by the English poet and author George Wither, is considered by some to be the first "true" hymnal of the English church, since it contains original poetry not exclusively based on the Psalms. Orlando Gibbons contributed some selections to the book, either because Wither had a royal patent to print the volume, or because Gibbons wished to counterbalance some of Wither's own music, which apparently was not very good, that was previously published in 1621 for a similar book. Gibbons was known primarily as an organist and "virginalist" (a virginal is a type of keyboard, similar to a harpsichord), but his

choral music is more well known today. Wither was a Puritan and a staunch critic of the Crown. He was imprisoned for criticizing the court in a pamphlet entitled "Abuses Stript and Whipt" (1613) and again for "Withers Motto" (1621). A prolific Puritan writer and a captain in the English Civil War, he achieved the distinction of being imprisoned by <u>both</u> parties!

In the late 1740's, J. S. Bach revisited organ pieces that he had written some thirty years earlier while he was organist at the ducal court of Weimar. At least fourteen pieces were extensively reworked, and four others were either composed for the collection or had been included by students who acted as scribes for the composer, who by 1750 had lost his eyesight. It is thought that Bach's ultimate intention was to have them published, but he died before that could happen. The pieces were not unknown by organists, but full publication of the so-called "Great Eighteen" chorales didn't happen until Felix Mendelssohn performed them publicly in Leipzig and edited the first publication. "Komm Gott, Schöpfer, heiliger Geist (Come, God, Creator, Holy Spirit) is an extended version of a shorter piece based on the Lutheran setting of the plainchant "Veni Creator Spiritus."
