

# A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.





Music Notes The composer of our Offertory anthem, William Bradley Roberts, is currently Professor of Church Music at Virginia Theological Seminary and Director of Chapel Music. He received the Bachelor of Arts degree from Houston Baptist University with double majors in Voice and Music Education. He received the degrees Master of Church Music and Doctor of Musical Arts from Southern Seminary (Louisville, Ky.) with an emphasis in Conducting and Voice. Roberts was ordained to the priesthood in May 2016. Prior to his coming to Virginia Seminary, he was an Episcopal church musician for thirty-three years, the most recent position being St. John's, Lafayette Square, Washington, D.C. Before that, he held similar posts in Tucson, Arizona; Newport Beach, California; Louisville, Kentucky; and Houston, Texas.

The hymn "My Shepherd will supply my need" was written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), an English pastor, preacher, poet, and hymn writer. He wrote close to 600 hymns including "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross," "Am I a Soldier of the Cross," and "Joy to the World." Considered the founder of English hymnody and children's hymnody, he published books of poetry, hymns, and three volumes of theological discourses. The tune, called *Resignation*, is an old American folk-tune which appeared with this text in hymnals as early as the 1850's. Virgil Thomson's setting reflects the straightforward simplicity of style advocated by this most American of composers. He lived from 1896 until 1989 and, in addition to being a composer, was the influential music critic for the *N.Y. Herald Tribune* from 1940-1954.

The text "Jerusalem, my happy home" is taken from a long poem found in the British Library and dating from 1616. The poem is thought to be a variant of one found in a 1585 publication called *The glass of vaine-glorie*. The author of the poem is uncertain, but it is thought to be a Roman Catholic priest by the name of Francis Baker. The later version comprises 26 stanzas of which 1, 6, 12, 22, 23 (combined with 25) are used in the Hymnal. The tune *Land of Rest* was originally found added to a collection of "shape note" hymns entitled *The Christian Harp* (1832). The original name of the tune was *Longing for Home* and was paired with a text beginning "O land of rest, for thee I sigh!" The harmonization of the tune (which first appeared with the "Jerusalem" text in the 1940 Hymnal) is by Annabel Morris Buchanan (1888-1983) and was originally printed in her *Folk Harmony of America* (1938) with the heading "Heard as a child from my grandmother, Mrs. S.J. Foster."
